Twenty percent of project funds will be allocated to U.S. Intercultural Ministries, 11 percent will be used for project promotion, and 4 percent will be applied to the Great Commission Fund.

Latin America

1. Argentina—\$500.00 Youth in My View—Coffee Houses

This project will sponsor coffee house events where teens and young people can have a safe space to bring their doubts about life and faith.

2. Argentina- \$2,500.00 Mendoza Church Plant

These monies will be used for literature, materials and publicity for outreach including events such as seminars on parenting, financial planning and other topics of interest that would build bridges into the community.

3. Brazil—\$6,000.00 Color Analysis, Inner and Outer Beauty

Reaching people in the wealthy gated communities has been effectively done by the Inner and Outer Beauty Seminars. The monies for this project will be used to sponsor future bookings for these events that reach the upper class.

4. Paraguay—\$15,000.00 ESL Project

One method used to reach the Paraguayans is to sponsor English as a Second Language classes for the community. Many people who would not come to a church are willing to come to a classroom for training in English. These funds will be used for materials, salaries, and classroom rental for ESL.

5. Uruguay—\$1,000.00—Introducing a New Church to a New City

This money will be used as “seed” money to conduct events that will allow a church planting team to be known and to break down the barriers in a new area. Soccer clinics, some emergency social help and some “get to know us” events are things that are planned. The national church will pay part of the costs, and this project will supplement what they can raise.

6. Latin America International Worker Mobilization Training—\$10,000.00

National churches in Latin America are beginning to catch the vision of sending cross-cultural international workers to other countries. These funds will be used to bring together international workers that will be assigned to Latin Mission’s Mobilization for training in topics such as establishing Latin structures for national church missions departments, criteria for selecting international worker projects, equipping national workers, helping local churches understand their responsibility to the international workers they send etc.

7. Latin America Evangelism among Professionals—\$10,000.00

Some of the most unreached people in Latin America are the professionals. International workers are working to reach these people. It is important that these international workers (which include Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, and Uruguay) can be brought together to pray, share experiences, and talk about evangelistic methods that are producing fruit. These funds would be used to have a three day conference for this purpose.

8. Dominican Republic —\$22,000.00—Bavaro/Punta Cana Community Outreach

Many people are moving to this area to search for jobs, leaving behind family and other connections. During this time of needing a sense of belonging, people are willing to come to community centers that provide meaningful activities and enrichment programs. It also provides a way to connect them with Christ. The monies from this project will be used to rent a commercial location to give seminars and training, ESL, and other events. The facility will provide family counseling, aerobics classes, scrapbooking sessions etc. Monies will provide a TV, DVD player, video projector, laptop and sound equipment, chairs and office furnishings, Bibles, books, and training materials.

Europe/Middle East

1. Creative Access Country— \$10,000.00 Community Center ESL/Women’s Exercise

This center houses a medical clinic, an ESL program, and a coffee shop. A new ministry to minister to women through exercise classes would be very beneficial. Funds are needed to remodel a room and provide exercise equipment in the center where women in the area can come to a secluded place and be able to exercise freely. This is a wonderful relationship builder for this target group. The other part of these funds will go to provide materials to continue the ESL program in this center.

2. Bosnia—\$5,000.00 Sarejevo ESL

The team in Sarejevo will be offering continuing education classes for high school English teachers specifically and anyone else in the education system who shows an interest. This is a strategic group to reach with the Gospel as they influence and shape many young minds. Funds will provide materials, supplies, and classes.

3. Russia—\$6,500.00 Open Door Outreach Moscow

This project will enable a growing and dynamic church to reach out to more people in a more effective way. The classes offered will be the Alpha Course, Scrapbooking, ESL, English Camps, and a Spanish Club. The funds will help furnish materials, a rental hall, and storage containers, and snacks.

4. Spain—\$12,000.00 Cinderella House

Cinderella’s House is envisioned as a Christian community where abused women will be able to experience emotional healing and be empowered and equipped to face the future. The funds given will be used to provide materials and to train workers to minister evangelistically through formational prayer counseling.

5. Creative Access Country-\$15,000.00 Community Center

The door is open for the Gospel at this time. The goal is to offer an Oasis for people to come and have their spiritual needs met through a Community Center. The funds for this project will go to furnishing a youth center and a coffee shop.

Asia/Pacific

1. Japan—\$5,000.00 Alliance Women Ministries One Day Seminar

Funds from this project will go to assist the field in holding a yearly conference to train women in topics of witnessing and missions along with other topics deemed profitable. This amount would allow several conferences in the future.

2. Taiwan—\$1,500.00 Evangelistic Materials/Scripture Portions for working class

The working class people of Taiwan consist of 70% of the population, while only 0.3% have a relationship with Jesus Christ. They are also the most overlooked segment of society regarding the Good News. The goal is to distribute mini-bibles with small portions of scripture in a booklet format with a modern translation. Along with this, the desire is to include Scripture Comic books and DVDs with a puppet show format because the working people enjoy this type of media.

3. Taiwan—\$1,947.00 Cidu Gospel Center’s Working Class Evangelism Materials

The Cidu Gospel Center is located just a one minute walk from a major market that sells fruits and vegetables so it is central to ministering to these people. These funds will be used to purchase an Evangelism Vendor Cart that can be used in the market, the Jesus Film DVD for weekly distribution, and Gospel Tracts.

4. Mongolia—\$32,700.00 International Church in Ulaanbaatar

Ulaanbaatar has a population of just over one million. It is the country’s only large city and is the center for business, government, education, arts and culture. Thousands are flocking to this city in pursuit of jobs and higher education. It is estimated that by 2020 85% of the population will live in this city. The goal is to develop a church planting ministry in this city. The monies received will be used for a sound system, keyboard, music stands, podium, guitars, video projector, promotional materials, Bibles, Computer, printer and internet connection with a webpage, nursery equipment, advertisement and signs, and rent of a building.

5. Indonesia—\$18,300.00 AWANA Leadership Training

Awana is moving towards a Leader-Based Model of ministering to children. These monies will be used to train and equip leaders to return home and train more people to help in evangelizing thousands of children in over 200 churches from 12 districts of Indonesia. They will provide part of the cost of food, materials, and publicity for these events.

6. Thailand—\$15,700.00 Life Development and Job Training Home

In the past year over 45 people have come to know Christ through a prison ministry. It is felt that as these men re-enter society they need to be trained with skills that will help them provide for their families. Along with this training it is the goal of this home to train these men to be church planters upon their return home. In this way, the Good News can be brought to many areas as these men establish house churches. These funds would help get this program started by purchasing furnishings for the building that will be built and job training projects.

Africa

1. Burkina Faso—\$22,050.00 Summer Institute of Evangelism

The Summer Institute of Evangelism is a vision to provide continuing education for pastors who have little hope to further their pastoral training but who are faithfully ministering in often remote areas. This initiative would involve inviting up to 100 pastors each September over the next three years for focused training in effective evangelism methods to broaden their effectiveness. This training would be held at a Bible School teaching them to do Storying (a chronological method of telling the Bible's story); how to effectively evangelize and minister to Muslims; New Life for All course; securing the spiritual harvest through intentional follow-up; how to bring Jesus to an unreached village and other topics. Funds are needed for partial assistance with travel and food, teacher's expenses, materials including books, hand-outs, tracts etc.

2. Burkina Faso—\$4,000.00 Equipping Women Evangelistically

This project includes providing tracts and evangelism/discipleship cassettes produced by African women. It also includes evangelism training seminars conducted by women for women along with materials. It will help to defray costs of evangelism campaigns that comprises a team of fifteen women who travel to villages.

3. Congo—\$30,000.00 North Congo Church Planting Centers

Northern Congo is the most unreached region of the country. In January 2009, our first couple will be moving to this area to work with national church planters. The workers will be establishing four centers where a church building, training area, and a residence for the local pastor will be built. Projection and sound equipment and literature will be purchased to be used in training and evangelism outreach. The funds will help in the construction of these buildings, and the purchase of equipment and literature.

4. Senegal—\$30,000.00 Reading/Study Center for University Students

Wolof believers are few and far between in the country of Senegal. There are 115 believers among a people group that is 4.5 million strong. By reaching out to University and High School students, we can introduce the Gospel to those who will be the leaders in Senegal in the future. The goal is to build a reading/study center near the Government University. This University attracts top students who receive full scholarship, training them to become the future political, business, and academic leaders of Senegal. The project would offer a library of reference books for class work and a computer lab, a quiet place to study as well as a place to fellowship and talk about faith issues over the local tea, attaya.
